Conference - June 9th & 10th, 2007

Great news! The 3rd PFLAG National Conference is now official, and will be held in Brisbane on the Queen's Birthday weekend in 2007 (at the Brisbane Convention & Exhibition Centre, Southbank)

Currently, Rodney Croome (Tasmanian gay activist) and David Graham of Big Brother (refer to previous story for further information) have indicated they are happy to be guest speakers.

It's our intention to have speakers talking on a very general nature - so that the information is relevant to all, regardless of whether you are travelling to the conference from North Queensland or Western Australia. We also plan to have plenty of participation from attendees at the conference.

For those travelling large distances, we hope to be able to subsidise some costs to allow them to attend. We also plan to provide attendees with a selection of costs regarding accommodation.

The Sydney conference in 2004 was great, and it helped to bring us all together and discuss our concerns, as well as swap ideas on how to become more active in the community. We hope to continue this process with our Brisbane conference.

With plenty of notice, we trust this is an event you can mark in your calendar, and look forward to seeing you there.

PFLAG & Open Doors Project

Open Doors is a Brisbane organization for young people (aged between 12 and 18 years) who are questioning their sexuality.

PFLAG was recently asked to join them in assisting parents with the understanding and acceptance of their child's diverse sexuality.

The plan is that after the sessions with Open Doors, parents can then access the general meetings held by PFLAG Brisbane, in order to continue their path to acceptance.

Website Update

The PFLAG Brisbane website received 12,033 and 14,634 hits in the months of July & August respectively, taking our total hits to just over 128,000 for the year.

These figures are made up of 449 and 463 unique computers for the same periods, respectively. 4pm was the most popular hour of the day to visit our website in July, and this changed to 9am in August.

386 users read our July newsletter online during the past two months. Yet again, Shelley's booklet "Sexuality is not a choice" is by far the most popular document on our website with 811 views in August alone. Shelley's booklet has been read online more than 3500 times in the past year!

For both the July & August periods, most website visitors surfed from Australia, followed by the USA, and then interestingly, the United Arab Emirates

Car Parade - National Day of Action

The 13th of August 2006 marked the second anniversary of John Howard making "husband and wife" or "man and woman" a compulsory element in a marriage ceremony. Therefore, an Australia-wide 'day of action' was called by the Australia Marriage Equality group.

While some states had protests, Brisbane's *Australia Marriage Equality* members along with PFLAG members Meryl, Andy and Shelley took part in a car parade around Brisbane.

We believed this was maximum effect with minimum numbers of people and effort. There were only eight cars, but all were highly decorated with rainbow flags, ribbons and messages drawing much attention from bystanders on footpaths and other drivers on the road.

We drove around the city and coffee-shop style areas (Bulimba, West End, etc) for about two hours, which was lots of fun! Following the parade, we had a picnic / barbecue at New Farm Park, which saw a few extra's come along to be supportive.

There were no negative reactions during the car parade we received waves, motorists honked car horns and bystanders were cheering.

It would appear that the Federal government is a little out of step with what people want regarding relationship recognition and equality issues for the lesbian and gay community.

We received no indication from anyone that they were unhappy with our Sunday drive.
