# Shelley's Day in the Sunshine

A couple of months ago Shelley was approached to speak at a meeting about the need for Australia to have a Bill of Rights, which she did.

From this Shelley was then asked to write a chapter for a book they're putting together with a collection of stories from 25 people about the varied inequalities affecting different sections of our society.

Shelley has now completed her chapter, and has also been interviewed for extra information. The plan is to have the book launching on December 10th which is Human Rights Day and for the books to be sold in mainstream book shops. We will see how this progresses.

# **Country Tour**

Shelley has been fortunate enough to make another trip to rural Queensland. This time, she has travelled with staff from Queensland Association Healthy Communities (QAHC) - formerly (QUAC), to Roma, Charleville, Cunnamulla and St. George.

Shelley spoke on radio where possible and sent media releases to the local papers so families could make contact and to be involved in the community consultations planned by QAHC if they chose.

# (HREOC) Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission: National Inquiry into Discrimination against People in Same Sex Relationships: Financial and Work Related Entitlements and Benefits

On the 10th of October, a public forum was held at the QAHC building. Fifty three people attended, which we're told is the largest gathering in any one city for this event. So congratulations to the gay community of Queensland, for standing up and being counted.

The formal hearing was on the 11th October and PFLAG were invited to participate. Fortunately, it was very non-

threatening but as always eye opening to hear other peoples stories and valid concerns.

Shelley came away from this event particularly aware of the struggle that many young people incur when forced to leave home and then have to struggle to support themselves. Because of red tape and lack of understanding or caring by the government bodies, are forced into difficult and sometimes life threatening situations to survive.

We feel sure that if a couple of high ranking officials, of this country, had an LGBT child in a similar situation, legislation would change and be more accommodating to their needs.

The findings of this hearing will be handed to federal government early next year with recommendations for change and improvements so we'll just wait and see what eventuates.

The second phase of this process will have begun by the time this newsletter is distributed. This phase will be involving children, adoption and parenting so more about this later.

...and continuing with the topic of apartheid, here is a cartoon which recently appeared in a South African newspaper.

South Africa is set to become the next country to provide equal marriage rights. The South African Constitutional Court ruled unanimously on 1 December 2005 that it was unconstitutional to prevent same-sex couples marrying when marriage was permitted for people of the opposite sex.

The court gave South Africa's parliament one year to amend laws defining marriage as a "union between a man and a woman" to a "union between two persons". If not done in time, the relevant sections of the Marriage Act would automatically be read so as to take away the legal requirement that a marriage be between two persons of the opposite gender.

Among those publicly backing the ruling were Anglican Archbishop emeritus Desmond Tutu.

The South African constitution specifically outlaws discrimination on the grounds of sexuality.
