## Military's recognition of Gay partnerships

# APPLAUSE FOR MILITARY'S RECOGNITION OF GAY PARTNERSHIPS

Gay activists have hailed a decision today by the Australian Defence Force (ADF) to give same-sex couples the same benefits as heterosexual partners in areas like housing and education assistance, relocation and compensation upon death or injury.

Tasmanian Gay and Lesbian Rights Group spokesperson, Rodney Croome, said the new policy will boost ADF staff retention and recruitment rates by making a military career a more attractive option for gay and lesbian Australians.

"This is a victory for common sense and for equality, but most of all it is a victory for the military because it makes the ADF a fairer, happier and more effective workplace for troops in same-sex relationships. The least this country can do for its service men and women is to treat them and their families equally regardless of sexual orientation."

The defence bulletin (or "signal") announcing the new policy was released today and declares that "Defence places great emphasis on ensuring its people work in an environment that is fair and inclusive, recognising that this enhances operational capability and effectiveness".

It creates a new category of "interdependent relationship" which will include all same-sex and de facto different sex couples.

To qualify a couple must show they have a close relationship and provide each other with financial and domestic support. The ban on gay and lesbian personnel was lifted 13 years ago.


Most western countries, including Australia's traditional military allies like Britain, Canada and New Zealand already recognise same-sex relationships in the military.
