Most would know where the "Wool Stores" are, and we are relatively close to them. Keep an eye out for our building - it has a metallic front and parking should be easy on weekends.

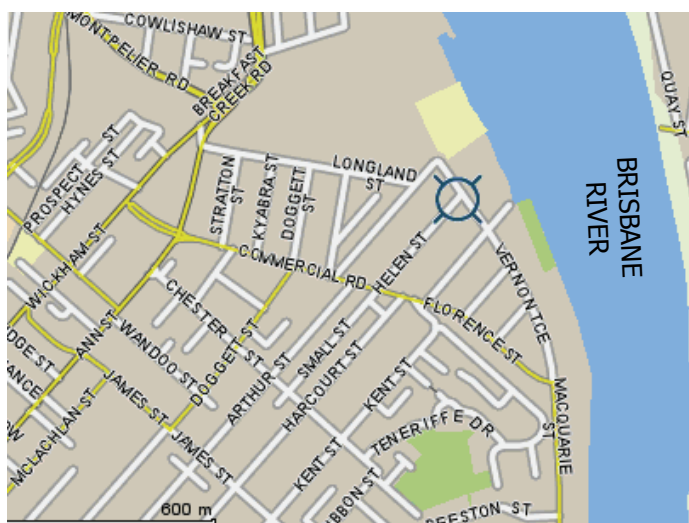

One of the biggest events on Brisbane's social calendar is Pride Day. Now in its 17th year, the Brisbane Pride festival brings together LGBTI (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex) members of our community - including their families, parents, friends - even their pets!

This is followed by a huge day ("Fair Day") of fun, food, stands & stalls, rides, drinks and entertainment at Musgrave Park from around 11:00am, when the marchers begin to pull in from their walk through the city. Kieran and Lynne are again organising our stand at Fair Day.

If you would like to join the PFLAG team and march with us through the city in the morning, please meet us at **King George Square** on Saturday 17th June at around 10:00am. In his message, Queensland Premier Peter Beattie reflected on previous festivals, and said "The Brisbane Pride Festival has recognised the richness of our diversity, the rights of the individual and the shared values of different people in the 16 years it was established".

Mr Beattie goes on to say that the "...theme of this year's celebration 'Show your true colours', is as fitting as the expression behind it - to highlight the individual styles of

The PFLAG Brisbane website received 11,645 & 11,786 hits in April & May 2006 respectively, taking our total hits to just over 87,700 since the website launched in September 2005. This is made up of 411 unique computers (visitors) in February & 386 in March.

6pm was the most popular hour of the day to visit our website in April, and 11am in May. For the same period, 275 people read our May newsletter directly from the website.

Once again, the most popular document on the site is Shelley's booklet, “Sexuality is not a choice”, which has been downloaded & viewed more than 1500 times since it was posted in September last year! Well done Shelley!

A meeting concerning an increase in the number of bashings was held at New Farm on April 6th between police and the gay community. The police did try to be helpful in most areas, but presently things seem to have gone a little quiet. Naturally, if people don't report bashings, the police can't respond.

With the Police force's blessing, the "Walksafe" project has widely advertised for people to come forward and

tell their story, even anonymously if they choose, by email but presently the numbers reporting aren't significant enough for major changes. The good thing about this is if problems arise again police are already alert. But, we will continue to ask questions and keep members updated.

Information Pack for Rural & Regional QLD

This project is still moving towards completion. We are still waiting for funding which we should hear about by the end of June but we want to be ready.

Basically, now all that needs to be done is the poster designed, completion of the booklet for rural families and proof reading of the hand book for the professionals. For those who may have missed the last newsletter we plan to print 5000 packs that contain information for families to gain understanding, assist LGBT with the "coming out" process.

Additionally, provide information for professionals who

work or come into contact with those in the LGBT community, plus a CD of parents' stories. Finally, a rainbow sticker and poster will be included so they can be displayed in the office or workplace to show acceptance.

It is our intention these packs will be sent to every high school, health centre and practice, library and police station in Queensland.
