I am writing to you discuss the issue of Plebiscite vs Free Vote in Parliament.

Changes to the marriage act have always been part of the parliamentary process. We never had a Plebiscite when John Howard changed the marriage act in 2004. We never had a Plebiscite when the legislation passed for indigenous people to marry without asking the Protectorate for permission etc etc.

Marriage is continually evolving and the meaning of marriage to individuals varies between couples. Marriages now are mixed race, mixed religion and blended families all with their own family values and beliefs.

If a Plebiscite is permitted:

- 1. It will be unnecessarily expensive for a country in economic crisis
