We have had very successful trips to Canberra meeting MP's, Senators and Ministers. We met members from all parties. Most, this time, seemed in favour of civil unions which wasn't what we wanted to hear. Only a couple were against equality relating to relationship recognition. We met with 24 MP's etc. including Malcolm Turnbull and Robert McClelland's advisor. We made comment that we haven't been able to meet with Julia Gillard or her Advisor, I travelled with 2 mums, Kath Kirkwood from Brisbane and Jenny Allen from Perth. We plan to travel again to Canberra in July for more meetings. I met with Senator Sue Boyce in Brisbane who is very supportive and helpful I also filmed a TV advert for Channel 7 which was aired in June. In Brisbane I spoke at a conference called *Mothers at the Margin* held at UQ at the end of April. This was well received. Numbers weren't large and most were already well informed.

I gave a presentation at Life Line to the trainee counsellors. This may become an annual event. Also in Brisbane I spoke at another "Marriage for Equality" rally. Numbers are growing and the rally passed without much incident.

Have been discussing the National Labor Conference in December and what PFLAG can do. I am in the process of undertaking road trips Perth, Adelaide, Hobart and Roma discussing marriage equality.

I met with a mother who is setting up a PFLAG group in Canberra – now time to send out packs and check on needs of each group.

S.S. Do you think same sex marriage will

be legal in the next five years?

M.K. Same-sex marriage will definitely

come to Australia and I expect within the

next five years. The notion that the mar-

riages of heterosexual people are some-

how threatened by opening up marriage

to gays is completely unconvincing.


Refusing a basic civil right provided by

law in a secular society on the ground

of the religious objections of a section

of society is wrong, and contrary to our

traditions of secularism and a fair go.



They also know that he's gay. And that not long after his coming out, Liberal attack-dog Senator Bill Heffernan, using parliamentary privilege, accused Kirby of soliciting underage boys while in a government car. Heffernan's evidence turned out to be forged. Kirby's grace in accepting the subsequent apology earned him a spot on Who Weekly's Most Beautiful People list.

After 13 years on the High Court, Kirby retired in 2009. These days he's just as busy in academia, as a mediator and on international committees.

Sarah Saunders from

Fifty Something magazine caught up with Kirby recently. Here are some excerpts from that interview.

S.S. Your judgments are described as "exhibiting compassion and thoughtfulness", you are a Human Rights Medal recipient and you're working with the UN - to what extent did your personal experiences as a gay man shape your approach to other human beings?

M.K. Growing up as a gay man in a society which was pretty intolerant at the time, made me realise the weaknesses of the law and of our parliamentary system. This realisation certainly affected my approach to human rights. If one does not learn from one's own life, one must be blind.

S.S. You came out publically in 1999. Why did it take so long? Do you ever have regrets about coming out?

M.K. Although I announced my relationship publicly with my partner, Johan Van Vloten in Who's Who in 1999, for more than a decade before that, I was closely involved in the AIDS epidemic. This was a kind of language for my sexuality. Everyone who paid any attention would have known where I was coming from. Some people told me that it was a mistake to "come out".

The media then try to define you in terms only of your sexuality. As well, the attack on me in the

Australian Senate occurred only two years later. However, nothing will change if everyone is required to keep their big secret to themselves. This is irrational behaviour. I hope that Johan and I have contributed to a more rational and better informed society in Australia.

S.S. If it was legal, would you marry your partner of four decades. Johan?

M.K.If marriage were available, it is not certain that Johan and I would get married. He says that, 42 years later, it is still too early to tell whether we are right for marriage. However, our own individual decision is irrelevant. The issue

> is one of principle and the availability of marriage to young people especially, who feel the need for a pub-


S.S. What's the secret to your relationship's Iongevity?

M.K. In my view, the secret of the long duration of my relationship with Johan is that we are good friends and companions. We never run out of things to talk about. He reads books all the time and tells me about

them. This, and lots of laughter, have kept us going for the entirety of our relationship. As well as this, when we have a disagreement, I always give in. This is what I tell young people. Give in. Look at the big picture. Even if you think you are right, you may well be wrong. And in any case, is it worth fighting over?

S.S. What makes you happy?

M.K. I think I am genetically programmed to be happy. Why should I not be? I have had loving parents, critical siblings, marvellous teachers and a magnificent partner. Mine has been a fortunate life.

ABOUT US

PFLAG believes that educating the community about sexual diversity makes people less judgemental and removes the 'fear' factor about knowing someone who is LGBTI.

PFLAG is totally voluntary and organised by parents. We believe there is a need to:

- Ø Help people become aware that sexual orientation isn't a choice.
- Ø Promote an understanding that those living in the gay community aren't deviant or lacking in morals.
- Ø Highlight the struggle of self loathing versus self acceptance.
- Ø Emphasize the prevalence of suicidal attempts for LGTBI youth between the ages of 15 and 24 years. (LGBTI youth are 6 times more likely to suicide than heterosexual youth).
- Ø Make people aware of the fear of abandonment by family at a time when acceptance and understanding is most needed.
- Ø Address the issue of homelessness and sexuality being relevant to 1 in 5 youth on the street or sleeping in friends houses because of family abandonment.
- Ø Educate the wider community to the risk of depression and drug and alcohol abuse by LGBTI youth when they suffer from lack of understanding and abandonment by family.
