ACTION AGAINST HOMO/TRANSPHOBIA IN QUEENSLAND SCHOOLS

In April of this year, PFLAG Brisbane formed an action group to do something about the discrimination and bullying of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex and queer (LGBTIQ) students in Queensland schools.

We knew of many incidents where students had been bullied by their fellow students and in a few cases by teachers.

Our vision is that all Queensland schools are safe and inclusive for LGBTIQ students.

Our Goals are:

- Queensland government policy and/or guidelines as well as government websites are in place to support LGBTIQ students and prevent homophobia and transphobia in Queensland schools.
- A "Safe Schools Coalition Queensland" project delivering LGBTIQ safe and friendly schools in Queensland is developed and supported by Queensland government.
- Training for Queensland teachers on LGBTIQ issues is available, both during their initial education and ongoing professional development.
- Information is delivered to parents through the Parents & Citizen groups and Parents & Friends groups.
- Information is delivered to LGBTIQ students in Queensland schools.

PFLAG and OPEN DOORS COLLABORATION



Open Doors Coordinator, Rocky recently approached PFLAG and requested assistance with a plan to extend the *JellyBeans* programme she runs for young transgender people.

The group meets on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month just for a bit of a social get together.

At the first gathering we discussed a budget for the programme, not such a fun topic but certainly a useful one!

PFLAG committee member Lynn then sent out an SOS to all PFLAG members to ask if anyone could help out with the second stage of the programme which was a much more fun topic - eating!!!

The first response she got was from a long time member, Veronica, who doesn't live locally but loved the idea so she kindly and generously donated \$200 to buy the ingredients for the cooking class.

Our own Deb Grading (committee member) offered to donate her time and skills to host the cooking class. Deb bought the ingredients and created a couple of menus and cooked and ran the show!

The feedback was great - all the youngsters really appreciated the time and effort that Deb put in and then the lovely Deb donated the ingredients.

So how wonderful for the JellyBeans programme as they still have the \$200 that Veronica donated to spend? As this programme receives no funding and relies heavily on donations from the community Rocky will no doubt put the much needed funds to good use.

A university placement student within Open Doors has created a fabulous little fun cookbook that has all Deb's great recipes in it. This will be put up on their website so that all the youngsters can access it at any time.

There are a couple more life skills that Rocky would like to pass on to the youngsters such as starting up their own little vegie patch, learning how to put on make up and how to dress according to body shape. Ultimately she'd like to have this all as a template that she can use year after year and pass on to all the different groups of youngsters that access Open Doors.

Considering that last year over 2000 youngsters went through those doors it certainly seems as though we have the opportunity to reach out and to help more than just our own children.
