Topics discussed included the role of conservative politicians in bringing about marriage equality, as well as the importance of winning people of faith to the marriage equality cause. The whole evening was recorded on video and we hope to see it available on the internet soon.

Grant application


PFLAG Brisbane have submitted an application for a Safer Queensland Community Grant, supported by Queensland Police and Suncorp Insurance. The application is for printing 13,000 postcards condemning homophobia and transphobia for distribution to businesses and public venues across Queensland.

Chris Pye from Relationships Australia spoke at the August meeting of PFLAG Brisbane



Chris Pye is the Rainbow Program leader at Relationships Australia. There are three aspects to his work:

- The Rainbow Service provides face to face counselling for LGBTI people, their family and allies.
- A social and emotional support group for transgender and gender diverse individuals called 'Transcendence' that meets monthly.
- Training that is delivered internally for the staff at Relationships Australia and for other groups.

Chris talked about the overwhelming issue of 'coming out' and the Cass Identity Model that defines the different stages of gay and lesbian development:

The Questioning Stage when repression and internalized homophobia can take over.

The Pride Stage when the feeling is 'I am going to be who I am' and the gay culture appears the only source of support. The Normalising stage when the euphoria of coming out is over and it is accepted that being gay or lesbian is only one aspect of life and that family and friends are very necessary.


