For those new community members, Shelley Argent was an instrumental person in the development of PFLAG+ Brisbane over twenty years ago. Recently, there have been enquiries into Shelley's health status. Here is what Shelley has to say in her own words:

"I was told a few weeks ago that I am now in remission, which is great news. Of course, I don't know how long this will last, but I plan to make the most of this extra time. When initially diagnosed I was told I had 2/3 months to live. So, now I jokingly say I am well passed my 'used by date' which is fantastic for me.

I am just beginning to drive short distances, but I am back to making my favorite biscuits, pies, jams, and sausages. I am back to sewing and best of all I feel well enough to be lobbying the government about the proposed Religious Discrimination Bill. Additionally, I am looking to do some work with a group called the Bravery Box that supports children with cancer and their families

Just.Equal Australia and PFLAG Australia have called on supporters of LGBTIQA+ equality to join the campaign against the Religious Discrimination Bill by sending submissions to the two current inquiries into the Bill. National PFLAG spokesperson, Shelley Argent, said, "Please send an email to these two inquiries right now because they close very soon and we need Canberra to hear us. 20 years ago, Linsey and Paul's son turned 3 and asked for a pink bedroom and a pink dressing table. It was at that moment when they knew that they would be entering a wonderful rainbow world and were going to be "PROUD PARENTS AND ALLIES". Linsey joined PFLAG+ Brisbane 10 years ago when her son came out as gay. She also has a daughter who identifies as queer, and another son who is a proud ally. She has been an avid supporter of Brisbane Pride for the past few years, marching down Brunswick Street and helping with the PFLAG+ Brisbane stall, and more recently has been providing COVID-safe hugs at the "Free Mum Hugs" stall. Additionally, Linsey has marched in Sydney's Mardi Gras in the PFLAG Sydney group, and most recently, attended the COVID safe Mardi Gras, Sydney 2021 at the SCG.

Whilst at Brisbane Pride - Linsey noticed how people within the LGBTIQ+ community loved wearing badges with their flag or their pronouns on, or anything rainbow. She then had the idea to start handmaking them here in Brisbane and offering personalised badges. She also makes bulk orders for organisations and recently made hundreds of badges for various LGBT groups including the "78ers". LPBadges donates a percentage of their profits to local LGBT organisations.

Healing Beyond Discovery

PFLAG+ Brisbane supports all sorts of people and loved ones in the LGBTIQA+ community. Recently, we encountered a personal story from a woman whose husband of 18 years came out after years of marriage and raising three beautiful children.

"11 years ago, when I discovered totally by accident that my husband of 18 years was bisexual/gay, there was no support available to help me. It took 8 months to find a counsellor that was willing to try and help me. To this day, there are no services to support the trauma caused by this situation."

Thankfully, **Healing Beyond Discovery** is a peer-to-peer support group on Facebook for Australian and New Zealand residents which is run by volunteers with lived experiences. It is a confidential and invite only space that promotes respectful, positive healing.

Shot mostly across rural Otago, the film is an international co-production among New Zealand, Australia, the United Kingdom, and Canada. The film deals with themes such as love, grief, resentment, jealousy, and sexuality.
