Notes from 4th June Community Meeting

We had a great turnout at our Zoom Community meeting on the 4th of June. There were many new families, as well as many older, ongoing supporters to make for a wonderful virtual gathering. We were also fortunate enough to have families in attendance from far afield: Townsville, Toowoomba, Cairns, Hervey Bay, and the Sunshine Coast! Additionally, we were privileged to have **Carolyn Rogers** as a guest speaker. Carolyn is a Rainbow Counsellor with an LGBTIQ+ informed, affirming, and supportive background. She and her colleagues hope to break down the barriers that our young LGBTIQ+ people face daily.

Based on the questions that Carolyn received from our group, she recommended that our young gender diverse people get an *immediate* referral from their GP to the Brisbane Children's Hospital Gender Clinic due to the long waiting period for this service. This referral will allow for their medical/transition journey to begin as soon as possible. Should they choose to cancel the appointment at any point for whatever reason, this opening allows another young person on the list to jump in sooner. No harm there!

Next, Carolyn discussed the importance of connecting with safe and qualified organisations to address immediate mental health issues. Some organisations mentioned during the discussion included:

Carolyn also reminded parents and friends that longer term care for our young ones includes such resources as Relationships Australia's *Transilience* program (for children aged 6-12), and the *Transcendence* program meetings for older kids.

During the discussion, **Headspace** was also recognised as a great resource for LGBTIQ+ people and their loved ones. Stonewall Medical Centre, Haven Psychology, Open Doors, Holdsworth House, Left of Centre Therapies, the Centre for Human Potential's *'Journey to Gender'* program, and PFLAG+ Brisbane were also mentioned as additional resources for parents and friends to investigate as longer-term resources, depending upon where they are in their journeys.

In closing her presentation/discussion, Carolyn mentioned that 56% of all LGBTIQ+ people will not access or book themselves into counselling due to previous discriminatory experiences. She stated that it is very important to allow our young people to have a say in whom they choose as their counsellor so that they feel comfortable attending a counselling session of their own free will.

A huge thanks goes out to Carolyn for joining us in our PFLAG + Brisbane meeting. She enriched our knowledge, shared her experiences, and all the while, educated us on our views toward our LGBTIQA+ loved ones. Many thanks from PFLAG+ Brisbane!

Being trans or gender diverse is viewed as part of the natural spectrum of human diversity by Children's Health Queensland and the Australian Standards of Care and Treatment Guidelines that inform our practice."
