Canada is one of the most LGBT friendly places to visit

The yearly *Spartacus* report informs potential travellers about the state of LGBT+ rights in 202 countries and uses a points system. Canada topped the index with a total score of 12. While Malta, Sweden and Austria also scored 12 points, Sweden and Austria received a negative point for still legally allowing <u>conversion therapy</u>, Canada scored neutrally, <u>with legislative efforts to ban the practise ongoing</u>.
