A Year in Review – 2018

This year we have been fortunate to hear from several guest speakers, including:

March 2018 – Grace Grace, QLD MP for Education and Industrial Relations

Upon entry into her new government role, Grace was able to share with the PFLAG community her support for anti-bullying, mental health initiatives, and anti-discrimination laws at the federal level. In the time since her visit in March, our new Queensland MP for Education and Industrial Relations has continued support for the LGBTQI+ community through personal appearances and support at our key events. Grace has been present at the recent Pride Parade and Fair, and hopes to reform the Birth, Death and Marriage Certificate requirements within Queensland, as well as re-addressing Queensland Government's initiative for "Safe Schools".

While his talk was specific to his personal experience, it was also aimed at the services that QUAC and the Brisbane/QLD government can provide young trans people and their families.
