Update on "Religious Freedom" Bill Debate in Parliament

Revamped religious discrimination bill is still 'unacceptable'

More religious organisations will be permitted to discriminate in hiring and firing staff under the government's revised religious discrimination bill.

just.equal spokesperson Rodney Croome said the new bill allows a broader range of organisations to discriminate against LGBTIQ+ people and others. Among the 11 changes are provisions allowing religious charities, hospitals, aged care facilities and accommodation

providers to hire and fire based on faith. The reworked bill also allows camps and conference centres run by religious organisations to refuse bookings from groups they believe are incompatible with their faith. "The government heard the LGBTIQ+ community say we want the bill to allow less discrimination. It gave us precisely the opposite," Croome said. (Source: QN Magazine online 10 December 2019)
