In Shelley's words, "Terminology has been changed, emotions have changed and so have the needs of many with LGBTIQ+ loved ones, which is great... Parents are now more concerned about their children's needs. And, because of improved rights, people who come into contact on a daily basis need to be made aware that discrimination and bullying is now illegal." Thank you, Shelley and the other LGBTI+ allies who have helped make these changes.

Additionally, there is a new welcome letter as well as a new history write up and video of PFLAG+ Queensland under the tab **About Us** provided by Shelley. In the words of Shelley, "It was a great pleasure to acknowledge the Coral-lea Benzie, the mother before me who organised PFLAG during a difficult time in Queensland. Coral-lea paved the way for me, as I have paved the way for others."

Also, the current situation regarding the **Religious Discrimination Bill** is addressed in our newly updated website. "If the bill is passed into legislation our LGBTIQ+ loved ones will be affected in a bad way, as will those with disabilities, those of colour, different races, and unmarried women with children. There is nothing positive about this Bill", according to Shelley.

QLIFE Resources

Rather than re-invent the wheel, PFLAG+ Brisbane is always looking out for other legitimate resources to recommend and utilise online. One of those is QLIFE, an anonymous and free LGBTI+ peer support and referral resource for people in Australia wanting to talk about sexuality, identity, gender, bodies, feelings or relationships.

QLIFE has a phone service from 3:00 pm until midnight every day. They also host a Webchat, which LGBTI+ individuals can register for and attend. There are several QGuides for

people/professionals working with LGBTI+ people, including the topics of Bisexuality, Coming Out, Gender Diversity, Suicide Prevention and a Glossary of new terminology.

Disclosure: Trans Lives on Screen is a new Netflix documentary, which came out in mid-June. The documentary explores the history of how transgender people have been portrayed in the media since the 1950s. It gains credibility by interviewing current day transgender men and women who are media writers, directors, producers and actors, while seeking their views on how transgender people have progressed through the years in their media portrayals. It is a Los Angeles- and New York-based documentary but shows a positive progression in the international view of the transgender community.

Since reviewing the book *Boy Erased* in this newsletter a few years back, Netflix has released the 2018 movie by the same name which is based on the book. It is a true story about a Baptist family in the USA regarding religious conversion therapy. The young homosexual man who wrote the story went through the Baptist religious conversion therapy and, fortunately, came out the other end as a gay man whom is living happily in New York with his husband. In many places, this type of therapy has been outlawed due to its controversial nature.

Read

Fairest by Meridith Talusan (Memoir). As a young child, Marc Talusan was enthralled with the music of Lea Salonga upon first listen, connecting with Salonga's lyric "I am the girl with golden hair." Writes Talusan: "But by the time she sang, "What a joy! What a life! What a chance!" a few moments later, I had already returned to my own body, the body of a boy in the Philippines who just happened to have her hair. My future may hold riches, but I would not live it as a beautiful woman."

The Gravity of Us by Phil Stamper (Youth Fiction). Teen boys find love when their parents' NASA mission uproots their lives in this sweet debut perfect for Adam Silvera fans. As a successful social media journalist with half a million followers, seventeen-year-old Cal is used to sharing his life online. But when his pilot father is selected for a highly publicized NASA mission to Mars, Cal and his family relocate from Brooklyn to Houston and are thrust into a media circus.
