A CIRCLE IN A ROOM FULL OF SQUARES by Suzanne Covich [Editor] [ISBN 0-646-42923-X]

To all the people who live what it means to be different - A Circle in a Room Full of Squares is a significant collection of writing by young people about their lives and experiences at school and in the world. It deals with issues such as bullying, body image, transgenderism, "being cool", mother-daughter/father-son relationships, self-harming behaviour, death, abuse and the effects of the pressure to fit in. This collection will do much to further the understandings of those in schools who continue to treat bullying as a depoliticised practice which foregrounds individual differences and behaviours as the source of the problem. As Claire Dalglish writes in this book, bullying is often a consequence of "not being yourself."

A LIFE OF UNLEARNING by Anthony Venn-Brown [ISBN 174110177-8]

Coming out of the Church: One Man's Struggle. This triumphant autobiography reveals the torment and guilt Anthony experienced as a conservative Christian who was, God forbid, gay. Whether you're gay or straight, a Christian or a non-believer, you'll find relevance in Anthony's tale and be touched as you join him on his journey of discovery. This is a story about living your truth - embracing who you are and living the life you were meant to live.

ALWAYS MY CHILD by Kevin Jennings with Pat Shapiro [ISBN 0-7432-2649-6]

A parent's guide to understanding your gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgendered or questioning son or daughter. Parents whose children are gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender or who are going through a "questioning phase" are often in the dark about what their children face every day. As a result, offering support that will comfort and fortify them feels like solving a puzzle with missing pieces. This book supplies the missing pieces by guiding parents through the world their child inhabits. Kevin Jennings explains what these teens often encounter – teasing and harassment – and offers solutions for parents who want to better understand their LGBTQ children and learn how to protect their self esteem. This book offers possibilities for parents to create the kind of relationship with their children that allows them to grow into emotionally healthy adults.

AS NATURE MADE HIM - THE BOY WHO WAS RAISED AS A GIRL by John Colapinto [ISBN 0-7322-7433-8]

In 1967 after a baby boy suffered a botched circumcision, his family agreed to a radical treatment. On the advice of a renowned expert in gender identity and sexual reassignment, the boy was surgically altered to live as a girl. This landmark case seemed all the more remarkable since the child had been born an identical twin: his uninjured brother provided to the experiment the perfect matched control. The so called twins case would become one of the most famous in modern medicine and the social sciences, cited repeatedly over the past thirty years as living proof that our sense of being male or female is not inborn but the result of how we are raised. But the case was a failure from the outset. The famous twin had, in fact struggled against his imposed girlhood and at age fourteen, when first informed of his medical history, he made the decision to live as a male. A macabre tale of medical arrogance.

BI ANY OTHER NAME - BISEXUAL PEOPLE SPEAK OUT by Loraine Hutchins & Lani Kaahumanu [Editors] [ISBN 1-55583-174-5]

The authors debunk the concept that people are either heterosexual or homosexual and that bisexual women and men are fence sitters. Bi Any Other Name will help tremendously in securing for the bisexual community its rightful place within the larger movement for genuine progressive social change – a movement that will ultimately liberate us all – Warren J Blumenfeld. Rejected by both gay and straight worlds, bisexuals have been a community in exile. With this rich and varied collection, however, bisexual women and men step forward into their own historical spotlight. The writing here, challenging and authentic, can only deepen our discussions about passion and politics.

BRAIN SEX by Anne Moir, Ph.D and David Jessel [ISBN 0-385-31183-4]

In Brain Sex, geneticist Anne Moir and journalist David Jessel take you on an extraordinary journey from the sexual differentiation of the prenatal brain to the gender differences inherent in kindergarten playstyles, classroom abilities and adult attitudes toward love, sex and marriage. A startling new perspective on one of the great puzzles of human nature, this provocative work is fascinating reading for anyone who lives with, works with or is just curious about the opposite sex.

CARLOTTA - I'M NOT THAT KIND OF GIRL by Prue MacSween [ISBN 0-7329-1194-X]

The Balmain boy who had Australia's first recognised sex-change operation – became the legend of Les Girls and one of our most iconic entertainers. This is her story. It tells of the enigma who is Carlotta, an enigma made up of three people: the young Richard Byron, who as a little boy had to fight to be loved; Carol the transsexual; and Carlotta, the showgirl who earned a place in Australian folklore. Her trademark warmth, humour and honesty shines through as she tells about her unsettled childhood, her transition to drag queen and the sex-change operation, her relationships with fellow performers and lovers and her twelve-year marriage.

COMING OUT AS PARENTS by David K. Switzer [ISBN 0-664-25636-8]

How do parents respond to the knowledge that their child is gay or lesbian? David Switzer, in a complete revision of his best-selling Parents of the Homosexual, helps parents understand their feelings and reactions to that knowledge and clarifies what it means to be homosexual. He explores recent scientific, social, and biblical information about homosexuality, emphasizes the need for reconciliation, and deals with common parental responses to a child's disclosure. He also provides a listing of additional resources for further assistance. This book is for parents of gay or lesbian children as well as for pastoral counsellors and clergy engaged in family outreach. Children, too, can benefit as well, from understanding their parents' struggles with this issue.

COMING OUT COMING HOME by Joan Golding & Peter Wood [ISBN 0 86786 262 9]

No reader will fail to be moved and informed by this lively and revealing conversation between Joan Golding and Peter Wood as they tell their own life stories and discuss the unique issues confronting the parents and families of gay and lesbian children. Coming Out, Coming Home... relates to average people who find themselves in the centre of... a different place to their hopes as both parents and children. It is not a book with neat answers and black and white positions. The only ground rules for the responses of these two people are integrity, grace and love... the ground rules of Christian faith.

COMING OUT TO PARENTS by Mary V Borhek [ISBN 0-8298-0957-0]

A two-way Survival Guide for lesbians and gay men and their parents - For gays and lesbians, COMING OUT TO PARENTS explores the fears and misgivings accompanying the revelation of themselves to their parents, providing suggestions on how and when to come out, what reactions to expect, and how to deal with the awkwardness that follows. For parents, the book guides them through the natural feelings of grief and loss and shows how understanding, compassion and insight can lead to an even deeper love between the parent and the finally whole child.

DESIRELINES by Peter Wherrett & Richard Wherrett [ISBN 0-7334-0951-1]

This is an extraordinary shared autobiography that begins with two brothers growing up above their parents' chemist shop in the western suburbs of Sydney in the 1950's. In this rich and episodic memoir, Peter and Richard Wherrett trace the complex and painful territory of a family life overshadowed by terrible secrets. It is a powerful story of survival and of how their childhood legacy set them on very different paths, losing each other for many years. A remarkable story of honesty, thoughtfulness and a desire to make sense of their pasts. Desirelines is a surprising and moving book, written by two sensitive and dynamic men. DUAL ATTRACTION - UNDERSTANDING BISEXUALITY by Weinberg, Williams & Pryor [ISBN 0-19-509841-2]

Bisexuality is a topic long ignored by sex research. Despite the early investigations of Alfred Kinsey, who discovered a continuum of sexualities, people who are not exclusively heterosexual in their sexual feelings and behaviours have usually been considered 'homosexual.' As a result, a great deal of attention has been paid to explaining why some people are homosexual or to the differences between heterosexuals and homosexuals. This trend has reinforced the belief that sexual preference exists as a dichotomy, that there are two natural classes of people whose sexual desire is fixed. Bisexuals, who do not fit in either category, have generally been seen as confused, dishonest, or in transition to becoming homosexual. We believe that sexual preference is much more complicated than this and will never be fully understood until the phenomenon of bisexuality is rigorously examined in its own right.

FAMILY OUTING by Chastity Bono [ISBN 1-86325-141-3]

From Chastity Bono, daughter of Sonny and Cher, heroine of the gay community: The first comprehensive narrative guide to the coming out process from the perspective of gays and lesbians and their parents. In Family Outing, Chastity Bono weaves her own dramatic story into those of other gays and lesbians to illustrate the phases, pitfalls, and rewards of coming out. We hear how gays and lesbians often feel indescribably 'different' when they are quite young, how they come to recognize and explore that difference in themselves and then deal, in various ways, with parents' reactions, those of friends and co-workers, and their own unearthed homophobia. Ultimately, we learn how enormously empowering the whole process can be.

HIS SECRET, HER STORY – Australian Women tell their Stories [ISBN 978-0-9758109-7-2]

The book contains the personal accounts of Australian women who have lived through a relationship breakdown due to their male partner's bisexuality or homosexuality. Despite feeling overwhelmed at first, each woman found previously undiscovered inner strength in the course of her journey. These powerful narratives told in the women's own voices, describe how their partner's sexuality was revealed, how they dealt with the crisis, and the inner qualities that each one drew upon in order to move on with her life. There is a perception of many women in this situation that they do not have the right to discuss what is happening in their life because it would involve 'outing' their partner to family or friends. This leaves many women isolated and unable to access emotional support at a time when they need it most.

HOMOPHOBIA an Australian History by Shirleene Robinson [Editor] [ISBN 978-186287-703-0]

Homophobia An Australian history breaks new ground by considering homophobia in a distinctively Australian context. In this collection, 13 well-known scholars examine the embedded homophobic attitudes that Australian gay and lesbian activists have fought to change. The book traces the evolution of homophobia, from its expression in Australia's past as a colonial settler society, through to its manifestations in present day society. The writers explore the ways in which many professions and social institutions perpetuated homophobic attitudes and raise awareness of the devastating impact such attitudes have on individuals and on society.

Each year a number of brave men and women will sit down and tell their parents that they are gay. By the time they tell their parents they will have lived with this knowledge for some time. It is the parents who have often only a split second to react. How parents react when they hear the news – a compilation of letters written by parents who have a gay or lesbian child. The letters have been written to be shared – to help parents cope and come to terms with their feelings, as well as assist gay men and women who are contemplating sharing the truth.

NOW THAT YOU KNOW by Betty Fairchild and Nancy Hayward [ISBN 0-15-600605-7]

"An essential survival guide for the coming out process." Enlightening and positive, informative and compassionate, Now That You Know has become a standard reference for families with gay sons or daughters. Written by two mothers of gay children, the book discusses the nature of homosexuality, counsels parents to respond supportively to gay children, and brings families together by maintaining the bonds of acceptance and affirmation. The authors keep parents up-to-date on the pressing health and emotional issues with a new postscript to their chapter on AIDS. They recognise that parents need to reach out to other parents and have completely updated their chapter on support groups, including PFLAG. Finally, a new, fully annotated bibliography serves as yet another resource for parents and children alike. Now That You Know won the Gay Book Award of the ALA Gay Task Force. Its authors were praised by the Advocate for succeeding in bringing parents and whole families "from the first moments of revelation through the guilt and recrimination, emerging on the other side of tolerance in love and joy."

OUT OF THE CLOSET INTO OUR HEARTS by Laura Siegel and Nancy Lamkin Olson [Editors] [ISBN 0-943595-84-3]

This is the first in-depth collection of true personal accounts written by the families (parents, siblings, grandparents, children and extended family) of gay men, lesbians, bisexuals, and transgendered people. These relationships are explored in six sections: We're Here, We're Family, Get Used to Us; What's Gay Anyway?; Expanding Our World; Taking Our Faith Seriously; and All We Did Was Love; I Know that you love me, but when I walk out the door who else will? The book ends with a poignant first person account by Dennis Shepard, father of Matt.

PETER KENNEDY, THE MAN WHO THREATENED ROME by Martin Flanagan [ISBN 978-0-9805643-6-5]

In February 2009 Father Peter Kennedy, of Saint Mary's Catholic Church in South Brisbane, was sacked by his Archbishop for contravening aspects of Catholic doctrine. This book is an assembly of voices. The introduction is by former Catholic priest and media commentator Paul Collins. Then there is a secular portrait of Kennedy as a man by journalist Martin Flanagan. Flanagan asks, not so much what has Kennedy done, but who is he? Freelance writer and author Michele Gierck stands with the congregation. Her book, 700 days in El Salvador, is an account of the civil war there, which she saw from the inside. She stands inside the church now known as St Mary's-in-Exile and describes eleven of the parishioners as she sees them. Then follows a variety of viewpoints on Kennedy and the Church today, what he has done and what the Roman Catholic church has done in banning him from his church. The voices range from singer/songwriter Shane Howard to international theologian Hans Kung. The case against Kennedy is lucidly put by Catholic academic Neil Ormerod. The book ends with journalist Martin Flanagan meeting Kennedy for a second time. Who is this man who threatens Rome? Is Christianity, as Kennedy claims, dying in Australia?

SAY IT OUT LOUD - JOURNEY OF A REAL COWBOY by Adam Sutton & Neil McMahon [ISBN 978-74166-545-1]

When Hollywood actor Heath Ledger finished reading the script for Brokeback Mountain – a film about a love affair between two American cowboys – he thought of his friend Adam Sutton, whose life was reflected in many of the film's themes, and told him, "I've just read this script and it sounds a lot like you." By nature Adam was a masculine daredevil who survived on the strength of his boisterous character. He was 'the crazy bastard' – the maddest, bravest bloke in the room – who faced tragedy, a prison stint and five long years on the road, but who could not face himself. His remarkable and unlikely journey from the world of cowboys, rodeos and stereotypes, to Hollywood and finally, to self-acceptance, is a powerful reminder that sometimes truth is even stranger than Hollywood fiction.

SIDE BY SIDE by Andrew R Gottlieb, PhD [ISBN 1-56023-465-2]

On Having a Gay or Lesbian Sibling - Andrew Gottlieb has done it again by providing us with new material that sheds light on the family ties of gays and lesbians. He helps us in innumerable ways, especially those who did not find acceptance, love, support and understanding in our families of origin. These stories put a face on sexual orientation issues and provide excellent examples of the possibilities that exist in the context of this special relationship.

SO YOUR CHILD IS GAY by Dr Jerald Bain [ISBN 0-00-638492-7]

This is a supportive and informative guide for parents of homosexual children and for the children themselves who need parental understanding and acceptance. So Your Child is Gay is the first Canadian book specifically written for families to deal with the issues surrounding children who are gay. It explodes the many myths, stereotypes and prejudices surrounding gayness and assists parents and other family members in dealing with their own inability to understand. It faces the questions that many parents have: Is it something we did? Can we not change our child? How can we tell our friends? What about AIDS? What does our religion say? Dr Bain draws on the stories of real people and lets them speak in their own words to readers. The result is a sympathetic, readable and informed guide that argues for empathy and caring in place of guilt and suffering. So Your Child is Gay is a much-needed book for families that reaches out to all members and offers insights and ideas for people who want to understand and love one another.

THE CHILDREN ARE FREE by Rev. Jeff Miner and John Tyler Connoley [ISBN 0-9719296-0-2]

Re-examining the Biblical Evidence of Same-Sex Relationships. Think the Bible condemns gay relationships? Think again. THE END OF INNOCENCE - A MEMOIR by Chastity Bono with Michele Kort [ISBN 1-55583-795-6]

In this riveting memoir, Chastity Bono recounts a story of love, commitment and tragedy lived out beyond the glare of the cameras. At age 23, Chastity was well on her way to establishing her own life separate from her superstar parents, Cher and Sonny Bono. Geffen Records had just signed her band, Ceremony and best of all, a love affair began to blossom with Joan Stephens, Chastity's long time friend whom she had originally met through her mother, Cher. In what began as an unlikely relationship, Chastity and Joan eventually found and nurtured a tender, loving partnership. Chastity's musical career imploded and she became caretaker and lover of Joan when diagnosed with cancer, discovering a depth and beauty that intensified her feelings of loss as Joan succumbed to the ravages of cancer. A story of love won and lost, of dreams fulfilled and shattered - is a coming-of-age story that takes a deeply personal look into the private struggles of a very public and courageous woman.

THE GOD BOX by Alex Sanchez [ISBN 978-1-4169-0900-2]

Sexuality or Spirituality - Why does it have to be a choice? Paul has dated Angie since middle school, and they're good together. They have a lot of the same interest, like singing in their church choir and being active in Bible club. But when Manuel transfers to their school, Paul has to rethink his life. Manuel is the first openly gay teen anyone in their small town has ever met, and yet he says he's also a committed Christian. Talking to Manuel makes Paul reconsider thoughts he has kept hidden, and listening to Manuel's interpretation of Biblical passages on homosexuality causes Paul to re-evaluate everything he believed. Manuel's outspokenness triggers dramatic consequences at school, culminating in a terrifying situation that leads Paul to take a stand. "The God Box" may well be a book that not only changes lives but saves them.

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE CLOSET by Amity Pierce Buxton, Ph.D. [ISBN 0-471-02152-0]

In two million marriages, one spouse is gay, lesbian or bisexual. Having a spouse or parent disclose his or her same-sex attraction is a shattering experience fraught with pain, confusion, anger and a profound loss of self-esteem. Amity Pierce Buxton spotlights this exploding phenomenon and reports constructive coping strategies that spouses and children have used to resolve problems of sexual damage, family breakdown, deception and homophobia. Illustrated throughout by riveting personal narratives, this expanded edition of "The Other Side of the Closet" traces the family's journey from initial trauma to eventual transformation. This invaluable source of information for spouses, families and professionals is based on Dr Buxton's eight years of research, including interviews with 1,000 straight spouses and children, her own personal experience and her counselling work with spouses of gay, lesbian and bisexual partners.

THE VELVET RAGE by Alan Downs, PH.D. [ISBN 0-7382-1061-7]

Overcoming the pain of growing up gay in a straight man's world. The gay male world today is characterised by seductive beauty, artful creativity, flamboyant sexuality, and, encouragingly, unprecedented acceptability in society. Yet despite the progress of the past century, gay men still find themselves asking, "Are we really better off?" Everything you wanted to know but couldn't think of the question. What would you do if you asked what sex your newborn baby was and your doctor said "We don't know?" Approximately one person out of every hundred is born intersexed to some degree but doesn't necessarily know it. The incidence is only slightly less than twinning, which occurs about once in every eighty births. What would you do if your little girl constantly insisted that she was a boy? For most people, sexual identity (their birth sex) and gender identity (the gender they feel themselves to be) coincide. For transsexuals and many intersexuals there is a conflict between their apparent biology and their innate sense of gender. Why? Researchers are now homing in on the genetic and hormonal influences that determine our sexual development and our internal perception of gender identity. An increasing number of scientists believe that transsexuals hold the key to solving the gender puzzle.
