Previous Meeting

Many thanks to Monica O'Mara, who came along to our last meeting and discussed policing issues regarding our sons and daughters.

We are very thankful to have Monica as the new State Coordinator for LGBTI Police Liaison Officers.

Straight for Equality

This is a project that was originally done in the United States and we have been given permission to adapt it to suit the Australian community. We hope to have this completed by the end of the year.

The project is about giving the straight community information on how they can assist the gay community

to gain the equality that the majority of Australians believe they should have; unfortunately the government just isn't listening. We will provide more information about this later as the project progresses.

Galaxy Poll - Marriage

In May, PFLAG Brisbane funded a national Galaxy Poll asking the Australian population if they believed same sex couples should be allowed to marry.

The response was 60% are in favour, which is a very positive sign for our sons and daughters. We just need to get our politicians to listen.

Galaxy Poll - Age of Consent

We are also funding a Galaxy Poll in Queensland regarding equality and the age of consent. As most would know, 16 years is the age of consent for heterosexuals but 18 for gay males.

There is no research to show that there is any advantage to this. Additionally, our gay youth are no more at risk of predators than our straight youth. Furthermore, a main concern is that if young gay males should get an STI, they are reluctant to seek assistance because of the fear of possible repercussions. Some health workers are reluctant to offer safe sex advice to gay males because of them being underage.

The Queensland government is aware of the gay community's concerns but just refuses to discuss this issue when in every other state the age of consent for gay youth is 16 years of age.

At a meeting some weeks ago, Shelley asked Attorney General Cameron Dick about this topic, but he was unable to provide an answer as to why it's different here. Anna Bligh just says "Queenslanders aren't ready."

Great Bake Off

PFLAG Brisbane, along with Open Doors, were again selected to receive half of the funds raised from the Sportsman Hotel's bake off. We plan to use the funds raised to put towards the funding of the Straight for Equality project.

The event was a great success and PFLAG Brisbane thanks The Sportsman's Hotel for their support.

Sexuality is not a Choice

As many of you would be aware, last year we had a summary of our *Sexuality is not a Choice* booklet translated into 17 different languages and uploaded onto our website.

A number of weeks ago, we were approached by the Australian LGBTIQ Multicultural Council (AGMC) which is part of the Federation of Ethnic Community Council of Australia (FECCA). This information will now be available to more people to help with their understanding of their sons and daughters.

Proposed forum for parents

A proposed counseling / support group for parents has been setup. Entitled "Keeping Families United", the support group will provide a safe and confidential space for people to overcome the road blocks in dealing with their response to having a gay, lesbian or transgender son or daughter.

The sessions will be facilitated by Paul Martin who has spoken at numerous PFLAG group meetings, conferences and has written articles for the PFLAFG Brisbane website.

The cost will be \$45 per session and there will be 6 sessions (to be paid up front). Parents can access the Medicare rebate of \$20 (per session) if they reach the criteria for a Mental Health Plan from their GP.
