



President's Welcome

At the time of writing this newsletter our country was undergoing sudden political change – historical indeed, steps taken by Labor in the hope of re-election. For us, the change of Prime Minister to Julia Gillard, gives us heightened hope of being that much closer to passing same sex marriage law.

Our numbers were down a little last meeting but in a way it was a benefit, as it allowed for so much expression of feeling from those present, in response to the presentation to the group by psychologist Paul Martin. It is a nice feeling to be all questioned out and for folk to go away better equipped with the knowledge shared on the day.

Early June we had a visit from the Anti-Discrimination Commission's office bringing us up to date with information and brochures for our use in the contact with people.

On Thursday 3 June, a few hundred people (including Shelley and myself), assembled at King George Square for the official opening of the GLBTI Exhibition now being held at 157 Ann Street Brisbane (opposite the beautiful Arts Building – easy walking distance from Central Station).

The exhibition has been three years in the making in collaboration with QAHC, Museum and State Library – covers the past 120 years in Brisbane and in particular the past 20 years, as celebration since decriminalization for homosexuality in Queensland. Set aside some time to view the contributions.

More recently Rainbow Labor ran a series of workshops Fri Sat Sun and Senator Louise Pratt WA was an invited guest. On the Saturday I met with Louise, Nick -

a young politically active man from Cairns, James – Equal Love from Melbourne and later joined by Christopher from Actor's Equity Union, who is responsible for fund raising events to assist those suffering with Aids. I spoke of the function of PFLAG and Louise was most impressed with the passing of the Surrogacy Bill in Queensland.

Senator Pratt stressed how important our letters were to the politicians and we need to continue attempting the conversion of the unconverted. Our stories and reasons for seeking same sex marriage need to be expressed – right of choice – other rights have been granted.

Another issue rose at that meeting of importance to us, is the age of consent in Queensland of our young gay men and linking it to health problems because of fear to seek medical attention. Interestingly, this subject was raised later at the BBQ with expanded thought, that it is not only our young gay men but generally across our heterosexual community as sexual activity is becoming younger and younger. Across the board there are health concerns for our youth.

Apart from the PFLAG hat that evening, I was approached as a mother of a gay son and aunt to my gay nephew, on my feelings, how I dealt with things, how did I know, why I do what I do, where are my guys at in their lives; shared feelings by those who approached was so special and one should never underestimate what seems so little in giving of oneself, makes such a difference to others.

Our guest speaker for July 24th meeting is David Wells, Counseling Coordinator QAHC. A projection for your diary - Father John Kilinko will be our guest speaker at the September 25th meeting.

Letters to Federal Government

Your son or daughter may not want to marry but they should have the right if they should change their mind. Also with an election coming up we need to be heard and taken notice of to bring change once the new government is in place.

It is heartwarming to see so many young people working to minimize homophobia in their local area. Our resources were well received at both venues.

We have had Nicholas a student from SCU doing placement with us for the last two months. While Nicholas was with us his primary goal was to help develop a brochure that is to be distributed to every high school throughout Queensland.

We still have several thousand brochures left over which we plan to distribute nationally. We had 75,000 printed so we could share them with other states and organizations.

Be an Ally and speak up for equality!

This was our last national campaign which provides insight into what our lesbian daughters and gay sons want society to know about them regarding them as individuals, teens at school, parents and as couples. The brochure also provides tips on how to be more inclusive.

This campaign was very well accepted and hopefully will help society understand our children more than before they read the brochure.

If you would like to distribute some of these as PFLAG groups interstate or as an individual please let us know. We will gladly send you as many as you like. Again we had extra printed so we could share our resources.

Australian Story

I have had a very interesting few weeks since the launch of my book, which is selling very well. David Graham who is always a pleasure to talk with launched the book for me and later a group of us PFLAG parents went to dinner with David and some of his friends which was great fun.

From the book launch I was approached by a producer from Australian Story on ABC Channel 2 and they are now in the process of filming family and friends. The story I am guessing will be aired on either the 12th or 19th July. So keep an eye out.

Surrogacy and Parental Recognition

As of 1st June our sons and daughters can be legally recognized here in Queensland. Mothers can now go and get partners names entered onto the birth certificates and surrogacy for our sons is now a real option.

The only conditions for surrogacy are that:

- All parties undertake counseling prior to the surrogacy arrangement
- All parties obtain legal advice before entering into the surrogacy arrangement
- Must be at least 25 years of age
- Surrogacy guidance report be prepared by an independent counselor ensuring that the whole process is in the best interest of the child is provide to the court.
