PFLAG marched with 91 members, family and friends, mostly from NSW. About 12 Queensland representatives flew down for the parade. The numbers were capped so places were hotly sought after, and after attending for the first time I can understand why. The parade, although extremely soggy and wet, was an uplifting and joyful celebration of diversity and inclusivity. There were over 120 floats and despite the saturating conditions, the crowd estimate was just under 500,000. Fred Nile's prayers for it to rain on our parade were this year answered, but it couldn't dampen the good cheer and loyal support from the participants or the crowd.

The support for the PFLAG walking float was incredible, and personally I was humbled by the number of people who just simply said "Thank you" to us. The Brisbane crew had a small 'shindig' of its own after the parade in Shelley and Don's hotel room and rested our weary feet over a couple of refreshing beverages. As a first timer I can heartily recommend making the trip. It was a chance to show and share how much we love our children and how proud we are of them and my only regret was that I wasn't marching with my son who is currently living in London. I made a late night phonecall to him after the parade though and ignited his passion to fly home for the parade in the not too distant future.

As parents of gay males and lesbian daughters this is very important and you can help! Regardless of whether your child wants to marry or not please write and support the gay community generally. What is important is having the right and choice to marry the same as their siblings and anyone else in society. Over the last couple of years as you would know I have been travelling to Canberra with other parents talking with MP's about this issue. We are now getting very close to the finish line and you can help.

• You just need to state why are you interested in this Inquiry? Eg. parent of a lesbian daughter/gay son.

• Why change is important to you? Eg you believe in equality, you want your child to have choice

• Tell your personal story eg age of child when he/she came out, was it difficult, how you felt

• Most important: on a covering letter write your full name, phone number, postal address and whether you want your submission kept confidential.

transition and/or attain gender reassignment. ATSAQ is a confidential, non-profit, un-government funded organization, relying on donations and membership for financial support. They provide support and information on all aspects of gender reassignment, for the general community and people who are experiencing difficulty with their gender identity.

The objectives of ATSAQ are to provide Queensland's Transgender population with as much support as our resources can permit. The areas we cover do include:

To continue a program of public education aimed at changing the negative images which the community may have with transgender people.
To provide support for family and friends of transgender people and help with understanding issues involved.

•To provide information on medical and health services available to transgender people.

•To continue to address the problem of legal recognition and human rights for transgender people in the state of Queensland.

•To assist with legal name changes and exchange knowledge on how to combat social interaction challenge.

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Gender & Sex What's the Difference?

Sex = Male / Female

Defines your biology via your reproductive organs.

Gender = Masculine / Feminine

This is you, your inner self. How you see yourself.

<u>Sexual Orientation [e.g. Straight, gay.</u> <u>lesbian, bisexual]</u>

Which sex, male or female, a person finds sexually attractive.

Sexual Identity

The anatomy sex that a person feels comfortable with.

Gender Identity

Mentally, emotionally, spiritually how a person see himself or herself.

TRANS = across or over, [cross over]

GENDER = any set of two or more categories, such as masculine, feminine and neuter, into which words are divided according to sex, animation, psychological associations, or some other characteristic and that determine agreement with or the selection of modifiers, referents or grammatical forms.

TRANSGENDER = an ordinary person with a medical condition - Gender Identity Disorder/ Gender Dysphoria

These are good terms because they are an accurate description.

The condition is related to the sense and expression of gender.

It has nothing to do with sex or sexuality. A person with this condition has a mismatch between the gender they experience in their mind and the sex of their body.

Usually, both the body and mind are healthy and that is why it is such a difficult condition to treat. There is nothing wrong with the mind or body they are just mismatched. This mismatch does however cause considerable stress and distress for the person with this condition. "Trapped in the wrong body" is an easy concept to grasp.

Medical science has shown that it's actually easier to change the body then to try and change the mind.

That is why treatment for this condition involves hormone therapy and surgery to change the body to match the mind and relieve the distress.

No one chooses to be a transgender or transsexual.

Transgender/Transsexual

In Queensland we use the term transgender to remove the reference of sex. The term transsexual is often avoided because it tends to have emotional or sensational connotations for some people. Both terms are accurate though.

Transvestite/Cross-dresser

A male person who is usually heterosexual [straight], sometimes married with children, who enjoys being a man but needs to wear women's clothing on a regular basis for relief and/or to express their feminine side.

Female cross-dressers are now so much a part of our culture and so common, it goes largely unnoticed.

Drag Queen/Drag King

The term Drag Queen is used to describe a cabaret show that involves gay guys dressing up outrageously to mime to a recorded song. Normally found in gay nightclubs.

Sometimes a transgender person will do this to raise much needed money



"I'm not saying all homosexuals are paedophiles or all paedophiles are homosexuals, I'm not saying that.


"I'm just saying male homosexuals are grossly over represented in statistics. "Homosexuality is not natural and should not be regarded as an alternative

lifestyle."



» 2012 Theme - Infinite Love - over five kilometres of Infinite Love!!


- » Over 20,000 overseas visitors attended, with approx. 9000 marching in the parade
