While there I met and had some very useful conversations with Mel and Warwick from the Queensland Police LGBTIQ liaison group and with Glen from Qspace on the Gold Coast.

And along with others on the committee I went to the International Day against Homophobia and Transphobia and talked to lots of people about the work PFLAG does to reduce homophobia.

We receive calls for help from many parents of gay and trans children, and from gay people themselves. It is a privilege to be there for them, to be allowed to hear their story and their struggle and offer them the support of PFLAG.

In PFLAG we quietly and confidently work at changing attitudes in our society. Why not come and join us.

Safe Schools Coalition Australia – YES, it will reach Queensland

The Federal Government has provided funding for Safe Schools Coalition Australia (SSCA).

SSCA is dedicated to making schools safer and more inclusive for same sex attracted, intersex and gender diverse young people. It will create the necessary change and ensure that every student and every teacher in every school has access to a safe and inclusive learning environment.

A year ago PFLAG Brisbane started an action group "Action against Homo/transphobia in Queensland Schools". A wide range of organisations have joined the group, all of them involved in some way with our schools and young people.

The Queensland action group has met with the SSCA program director, Sally Richardson to learn more about the SSCA program and discuss how it will be delivered in our state. Queensland will come on board during the second quarter of 2015.

The key priorities of the Queensland action group are (1) a Queensland government policy supporting LGBTIQ students in Queensland schools and (2) the implementation of a Safe Schools Coalition in Queensland.

Despite considerable communication with Queensland education department they still do not have a policy in place. In August 2013 a policy did appear on their website but was soon removed after complaints were received.

We have written to Premier Campbell Newman asking the Queensland Government to re-publish the policy supporting LGBTIQ students in Queensland schools. The action group also asked the Premier to confirm that the Queensland government will back the delivery of SSCA in Queensland.



Queensland AIDS Council is 30 years old

The Queensland AIDS Council (QuAC) is an independent community based health promotion charity that is turning 30 this year. Formed in 1984 by a group of predominantly gay men in response to the HIV/AIDS epidemic in Queensland, the organisation grew to deliver HIV prevention programs, client services for people with HIV, peer support through Queensland Positive People and a strong voice on HIV and gay issues.

Today, along with continuing invaluable HIV prevention work, QuAC also tackles wider health issues for all lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex Queenslanders. The work falls under two main program areas:

1. Sexual Health (including the HIV/STI Clinic, Men4Men and 2 Spirits Programs)
2. Healthy Communities (focused on LGBTI Health, Mental Health, Ageing, CALD programs, a Gender Clinic in Brisbane and inclusive practice improvement)

Australian Parliament to Hold Inquiry into Recognizing Overseas Gay Marriages

The Australian Senate's Legal and Constitutional Committee will hold an inquiry on legally recognizing same-sex marriages performed overseas after Greens Senator Sarah Hanson-Young introduced a bill that would recognize them if passed.

Australia already recognizes heterosexual marriages which are legally conducted overseas and the Greens bill seeks to also recognize same-sex marriages performed overseas where they are legal.

MindOUT! Workshops in Mount Isa and Longreach

The workshop is designed for mental health and suicide prevention workers on providing accessible, inclusive, and effective support to LGBTI clients. This workshop will include topics such as: recognising the importance for inclusive services beyond 'treating everyone the same'; what is meant by inclusive practice for LGBTI people; and creating safe, accessible, and inclusive organisations.
